STUDENT DRESS CODE

Students must also conform to the other dress code requirements listed in the Student Code of Conduct/Student Handbook.

Shirts/Blouses

1. Solid purple, gold or white Polo, collared shirts or collared blouses are required.
2. All Shirts must have collars sleeves and be buttoned (short or long)
3. Logos/trademarks and lettering may not be larger than one (1) inch. All CSCISD school logos are permissible.
4. No zippers allowed on shirts/blouses
5. All shirts/blouses and undershirts must be tucked in to the pant or skirt; allowing belts to be visible.
6. Solid purple, gold, black, gray or white applies to optional undershirt for boys and girls including turtle-necks.
7. No visible stripes, checks, or other designs on all clothing. All CSCISD school logos are permissible.
8. Outer wear must be worn open not oversized. Clothing with any writing, picture, emblem, or symbol that depicts sex, violence, blood, drugs, alcohol, Satan, death or gore is not permitted. (This could include gang related activity or skulls, and any clothing not approved by campus administrator or admin. discretion)
9. Wildcat sweatshirts will be allowed.

Pants, Shorts, Capris

1. Style: Casual pants, shorts and capris. Color: Khaki, Navy Blue, Black (solid, single colors) (No denims)
2. Pants must be worn at the waist, and be properly hemmed or cuffed and must have a belt
3. Sweatpants, windpants, drawstring pants, warm-ups are not allowed (no athletic shorts)
4. Oversized, and/or baggy-style pants/shorts/capris are not allowed

Skirts/Skorts/Jumpers

Color: Khaki, Navy Blue, Black (solid, single colors) (No denims)

1. Skirts, skorts, and Jumpers length must be no more than 1” above the knee.
2. Skirts may have a slit/pleat which opens no higher than 1” above the knee
3. Standardized dress shirts, blouses, or turtleneck must be worn

Shoes

All types of “flip-flops” are not allowed. (Decorated or non-decorated) Sandals must have an ankle strap.

NON-UNIFORM DAYS

Administration shall have authority to waive the wearing of standardized dress for certain days due to special events or special activities. Students who choose not to participate in the special days are expected to wear standardized dress.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR DRESS CODE

The principal, in cooperation with the sponsor, coach, or other person in charge of an extracurricular activity, may regulate the dress and grooming of students who participate in the activity. Students who violate dress and grooming standards established for such an activity may be removed or excluded from the activity for a period determined by the principal or sponsor, and may be subject to other disciplinary action, as specified in the Student Code of Conduct. COMPLIANCE

If a student attends schools in violation of standardized dress, disciplinary steps as outlined in the Student Code of Conduct and Student handbook will be taken.

FINAL AUTHORITY

School administrators will have complete and final judgment on all matters concerning interpretation of the student standardized dress. Matters concerning appearance and dress not specifically covered in FNCA (LOCAL) Policy shall be within the discretion of the administration.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

In case of severe financial hardship, parents may contact the office of the Federal Programs Director to request assistance when financially unable to purchase the standardized dress clothing. Please note: having a child on the free/reduced lunch program does not automatically qualify the family for assistance.
